1). Naomi's instructions to Ruth to wash herself, to anoint herself, and to clothe herself, have all been with a view to \_\_\_\_\_.

2). The picture of judgment for the Christian, seen in the picture of Boaz's threshing floor, is explicitly pictured for us in Revelation, chapters 1 – 3. The Book of Ruth doesn't present the separation of the overcomers vs. the non-overcomers; rather, it is simply what will occur for that faithful Christian who appears at the Judgment Seat properly prepared. In Ruth 3:11 Boaz says that he will do for Ruth "all that she has requested." What did Ruth request? In the antitype of that, what will we request of Christ at that time? (Be specific from p. 4)

3). The identification of the Bride and the redemption of the inheritance are two inextricably linked events. Explain how the Book of Ruth shows us this.

4). Where does Boaz go to make the deal regarding the redemption of the inheritance? What is the significance of that?

5). After the bride is identified and the inheritance redeemed, what happens between Boaz and Ruth?

6). Again we need to set the order concerning future events, as seen in the Book of Ruth and Revelation.

- a) First - the identification of the bride
- b) Second - the relinquishing of the crowns
- c) Third - the identification of the one worthy to redeem the inheritance
- d) Fourth - redeeming the inheritance
- e) Fifth - a marriage union
- f) Sixth - regality

7). What is the purpose of the judgment that is to come down on Israel during Daniel's Seventieth Week?
